How a person with belief responds to the Lord. — **Genesis 18:1–8** Then the LORD appeared to him by the terebinth trees of Mamre, as he was sitting in the tent door in the heat of the day. 2 So he lifted his eyes and looked, and behold, three men were standing by him; and when he saw them, he ran from the tent door to meet them, and bowed himself to the ground, 3 and said, “My Lord, if I have now found favor in Your sight, do not pass on by Your servant. 4 Please let a little water be brought, and wash your feet, and rest yourselves under the tree. 5 And I will bring a morsel of bread, that you may refresh your hearts. After that you may pass by, inasmuch as you have come to your servant.” They said, “Do as you have said.” 6 So Abraham hurried into the tent to Sarah and said, “Quickly, make ready three measures of fine meal; knead it and make cakes.” 7 And Abraham ran to the herd, took a tender and good calf, gave it to a young man, and he hastened to prepare it. 8 So he took butter and milk and the calf which he had prepared, and set it before them; and he stood by them under the tree as they ate.

- ❖ **Belief causes a person to SERVE the Lord.** — “(4)...Please let’s a little water be brought, and wash your feet... (5)...And I will bring a morsel of bread, that you may refresh your hearts....”
- ❖ **Belief causes a person to STAND with the Lord.** — “(8b)...and he stood by them under the tree as they ate....”

- ❖ **Disbelief causes a person to HEAR the Lord.** — “(10)...And He said, “I will certainly return to you according to the time of life, and behold, Sarah your wife shall have a son.” (Sarah was listening in the tent door which was behind him.)...”
- ❖ **Disbelief causes a person to DISRESPECT the Lord.** — “(12)...Therefore Sarah laughed within herself, saying, ‘After I have grown old, shall I have pleasure, my lord being old also?’...”

- ❖ **The Lord CONFRONTS disbelief.** — “(13)...And the LORD said to Abraham, ‘Why did Sarah laugh?...”
- ❖ **The Lord DISMISSES disbelief.** — “(14)...Is there anything too hard for the LORD? At the appointed time I will return to you, according to the time of life, and Sarah shall have a son....”
- ❖ **The Lord JUDGES disbelief.** — “(15)...But Sarah denied it, saying, ‘I did not laugh,’ for she was afraid. And He [God] said, ‘No, but you did laugh!...”
