- ❖ **Godly parents _____ to the Lord.** — **Genesis 18:16–17** Then the men rose from there and looked toward Sodom, and Abraham went with them to send them on the way. 17 And the Lord said, “Shall I hide from Abraham what I am doing, 18 since Abraham shall surely become a great and mighty nation, and all the nations of the earth shall be blessed in him?”
- ❖ **Godly parents _____ the Lord.** — **Genesis 18:19** For I have known him, in order that he may command his children and his household after him, that they keep the way of the Lord, to do righteousness and justice, that the Lord may bring to Abraham what He has spoken to him.”
- ❖ **Godly parents _____ like the Lord.** — **Genesis 18:20-21** And the Lord said, “Because the outcry against Sodom and Gomorrah is great, and because their sin is very grave, 21 I will go down now and see whether they have done altogether according to the outcry against it that has come to Me; and if not, I will know.”
- ❖ **Godly parents _____ like the Lord.** — **Genesis 18:22–33** Then the men turned away from there and went toward Sodom, but Abraham still stood before the Lord. 23 And Abraham came near and said, “Would You also destroy the righteous with the wicked? 24 Suppose there were fifty righteous within the city; would You also destroy the place and not spare it for the fifty righteous that were in it? . . . 30...Suppose thirty should be found there?” . . . 31...Suppose twenty should be found there?” . . . 32...Suppose ten should be found there?” And He said, “I will not destroy it for the sake of ten.”

- ❖ **A family's _____ can be compromised. — Genesis 19:14** So Lot went out and spoke to his sons-in-law, who had married his daughters, and said, “Get up, get out of this place; for the Lord will destroy this city!” But to his sons-in-law he seemed to be joking. . . . 15 When the morning dawned, the angels urged Lot to hurry, saying, “Arise, take your wife and your two daughters who are here, lest you be consumed in the punishment of the city.” 16 And while he lingered, the men took hold of his hand, his wife’s hand, and the hands of his two daughters, the Lord being merciful to him, and they brought him out and set him outside the city.
